Electrofishing Basics

CSP2205

Course Description

This course provides field-based skills in conducting electrofishing sampling. Topics include an overview of equipment and applications, safety, transport, assembly, water conductivity and turbidity measurements, crew communications, control settings, accessory equipment, and electrofishing gear. Participants will gain hands-on experience with backpack, barge, boat, or raft electrofishing equipment. Instructors include Tribal members and staff from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and Bureau of Indian Affairs.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Perform common electrofishing tasks using backpack, barge, boat, or raft;
- Understand and effectively manage safety risks;
- Operate gear to minimize fish stress, injury, and mortality;
- Use output goal tables to guide electrical settings;
- Assemble, operate and maintain various electrofishing gear types; and
- Troubleshoot simple equipment faults.
